- Prevented eviction for 3,612 neighbors



## Distributing hope looks like 5,200 food boxes and other basic essentials.



At Good Samaritan, we believe in meeting our community members where they are. When our Latino, Asian and Black neighbors were the hardest hit by the pandemic, we knew that familiar loving faces and resources would go a long way. We wanted to make sure our neighbors feel supported during a difficult time by assisting them in meeting some of their basic needs:

- Every Wednesday from 2020-2021, we distributed
   100 free food boxes to the Bayview and Mission communities.
- Every month, we distribute diapers, gift cards, and hygiene bags to families in Potrero Hill, Candlestick Park and the Bayview.

Our passionate staff and volunteers make sure every person is treated with dignity: from remembering their names to making sure they know we are here to help in any way we can.
